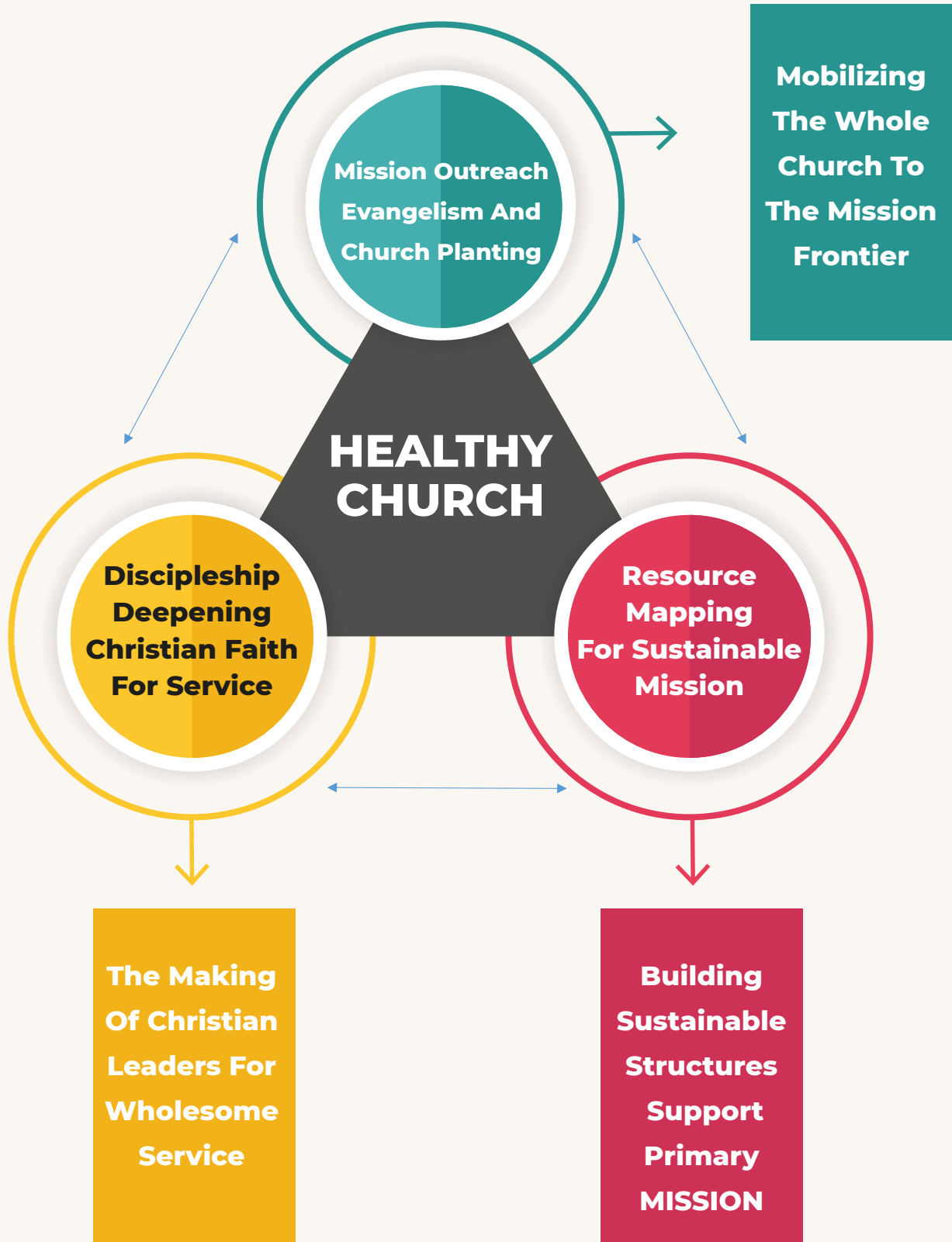

Am delighted to share with you what God has accomplished through

our ministry in the year 2021.

The theme for the year was; **FOLLOWING GOD'S LEADING.**

The work of missionary undertaking has never been easy at any given time in history. Isaiah 6: 8 “whom shall I send and who will go for us” is both calling and a challenge at the same time. God is always seeking men and women willing to step out into missions with a sacrificial heart. The calling and challenge in Isaiah is relevant and even more challenging as it was even then.

**The challenge of Modernity and Materialism:** The current church is faced with the challenge of modernity and quest for material acquisition as the ultimate of self-actualization. While modernity and material things are not evil, the reality is that the

missionary enterprise has been crucified at the altar of these two phenomenon's leaving the church with traditional ministry of maintenance and institutionalism. The ultimate price has been adopting professional and business approach to ministry hence eroding the very essence the church exists.

**Misconception of evangelism:** One of the most misunderstood concepts in the church is “Evangelism “It is important to note that evangelism has been regarded as inferior to any other calling and ministries in the church. Ephesians 4: 11 Paul writes that Christ called some to be Apostles, some Prophets, some Evangelists, some Pastors and some Teachers for equipping the saints for works of ministry. Going by Paul's chronological order. Those called into the office and ministry of Evangelists are pegged third in the order. My presupposition however is that all gifts are equal and no one can claim to be superior to another. Because of lack of recognition and looked down upon as inferior, including lack of structural support. Many evangelists have either quit ministry or translated themselves into pastors.

It is important to underscore that Evangelism is primarily the ministry that unlocks doors to Christian conversion. Evangelists are by calling pioneers and church planters. They champion the course of Christianity as heralds of the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ.

**Reason for existence for Missions Anglicanes Afrique:** It is for this reason we believe that the first responsibility of any growing church is to raise evangelists as carriers and witnesses of Christian faith wherever they go. A growing Church invests in people the human resource for God's kingdom. In the year 2021, through our Healthy church course, WE mobilized and trained over *1600 both clergy and Evangelists* for primary evangelism and church planting. To this effect, over *120 new churches were planted and many cell groups established, including evangelization and conversion of teenagers in schools.*

**Strategy of implementation:** The point of entry in every Diocese is Healthy Church capacity building program, a mission training course targeting clergy and laity. The emphasis of the training is on Evangelism, discipleship and church planting. We then offer one hundred seater tent to a diocese that is used rotationally to plant Churches in various parts of the Diocese. When a Diocese plants more than five Churches, Missions Anglicanes Afrique contributes roofing iron sheets to support the newly planted churches. We glorify God because this strategy has been very successful as you will read in the ministry report from Mission Coordinator.

**Growth of Missions Anglicanes Afrique:** Since its inception in 2019, we have grown both in Ministry and in staffing; currently we have three full time staff working across the region.

## The Mission`s Desk Report

### 1. Healthy Church Capacity Building

The program aims at offering both knowledge and skills for church leaders as primary agents of the Great commission called to serve the church of Jesus Christ. The program focuses on achieving the following

- i. Preparing church leaders to fulfil their primary calling which is making disciples through Evangelism, Discipleship, church planting and Social Mission.
- ii. Partner with Bishops and likeminded partners to ensure that social Mission work remains the primary focus for church in Africa.
- iii. Train grass root clergy, evangelists and all Lay Readers at the local church levels.  
Offer strategic support by providing Tents for newly planted churches in Africa.

Due to the emergence of Covid-19 pandemic AMA was adversely affected and this led to the adoption of technological use in Trainings.

For the better part of this year most trainings were done virtually i.e by the use of zoom and Google Meet Technological avenues.

### Challenges Faced in Healthy Church Capacity Building Program

1. Inadequate Training materials.
2. COVID-19 Lockdown measures.
3. Lack of Reporting or Monitoring and Evaluating tools for the work done.
4. Internet and Technology challenges during virtual trainings.
5. Lack of enough funds to conduct more trainings.

## 2. Urban Orientation Capacity Building Program

The rate of urban growth in Africa is on the increase. Mostly caused by several factors such as civil wars, rural urban migration among many others. The urban surge has become a major mission challenge to the church in Africa. This is because most of theological colleges in Africa have not embraced urban studies as a discourse. Through AMA, sensitization of Bishops, clergy and laity is done on the need and urgency of developing practical urban mission strategies responding to the plight of urban community.

The training was dispensed in a three month period in which it was carried out in the first week of each month. The main Strategic Goal for This training is “Empower Christian workers in the Urban World with practical and Transformative skills for Urban Ministry.”

### Challenges Faced in Healthy Church Capacity Building Program

1. Technological problems of connections
2. The concept of Urban Mission has not yet been adopted well by Church workers.
3. Lack of training materials.
4. Lack of trainees paying their registration fees of Ksh. 10,000/=
5. There is lack of goodwill among clergy and church leadership in Urban Mission.

## 1. School Outreach Discipleship Ministry Program

School outreach and Discipleship program carries the future of a nation.

Over the years the church has focused on adult ministry leaving students in our institution of learning unattended to. Kenyan statistics shows that people below the age 35 years stand at 35.7 million, thus 75.1% of total population. This constitutes the children and youth who are in our learning institution. Hence this depicts the generation that carries the future while growing up ill-equipped.

It is in this premise that Missions Anglicanes Afrique is and will champion and equip the church to focus its ministry to institution of learning.

The Strategic Goal for School outreach Ministry is: “Effective Ministry to Students across the Spectrum of Learning Institutions.” Missions Anglicanes Afrique (AMA) acknowledges the urgency in molding the children and youth for the betterment of the nation and the future of the church. It in this regard that we intend to:

1. Turn all learning institutions into mission frontiers. Learning institutions provide opportunity of reaching thousands and millions of young people, all of them into confined spaces with open minds, to receive the gospel of Jesus Christ.
2. Schools, colleges and universities are Centers of influence for both positive and negative worldviews/ideologies and philosophies that contradict Biblical faith thus subjecting majority of young people to embrace secular trends and lose out on their Christian faith.
3. The most pressing is the growing culture that encourages alternative life styles and trends driven by secular humanism that is in constant denial of God and promoting self-centeredness and values that are not in line with Biblical values. *Young people are the main target and easy prey for all these negative vices in societies across the world.*

The above intentions will be actualized by:

1. Leveraging on the existing Christian unions and fellowships in schools: This is in appreciations that we already have existing ministries making significant impact in Kenyan schools. Our motivation is to collaborate with Scripture Unions, Kenya Students Christian Fellowship (KSCF) and Fellowship of Christian Union (FOCUS) Kenya to enhance ministry to students.
2. Coordinate and run the following programs :
3. Formation and Equipping of Mission Teams in Dioceses.
4. Wholesome Teen tour
5. Chaplaincy conferences
6. Learning Institutions Discipleship (Primary –University)

- 70, 000 Teenagers evangelized out of which 38, 000 have given their lives to Christ
- Out of these 102 newly planted churches, Missions Anglicanes Afrique has supported three churches with roofing iron sheets.
- AMA also participated in the Community work in the ground breaking work in the construction of Tafakari Centre in Kibera Slums on 15th December 2021 which will serve to help the poor.

3. Training 100 church workers in Church Administration

6. Launching of Anglican care ministry to offer social support to people stricken by calamities.
7. Host Anglican Global Mission Summit conference

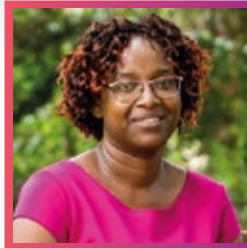

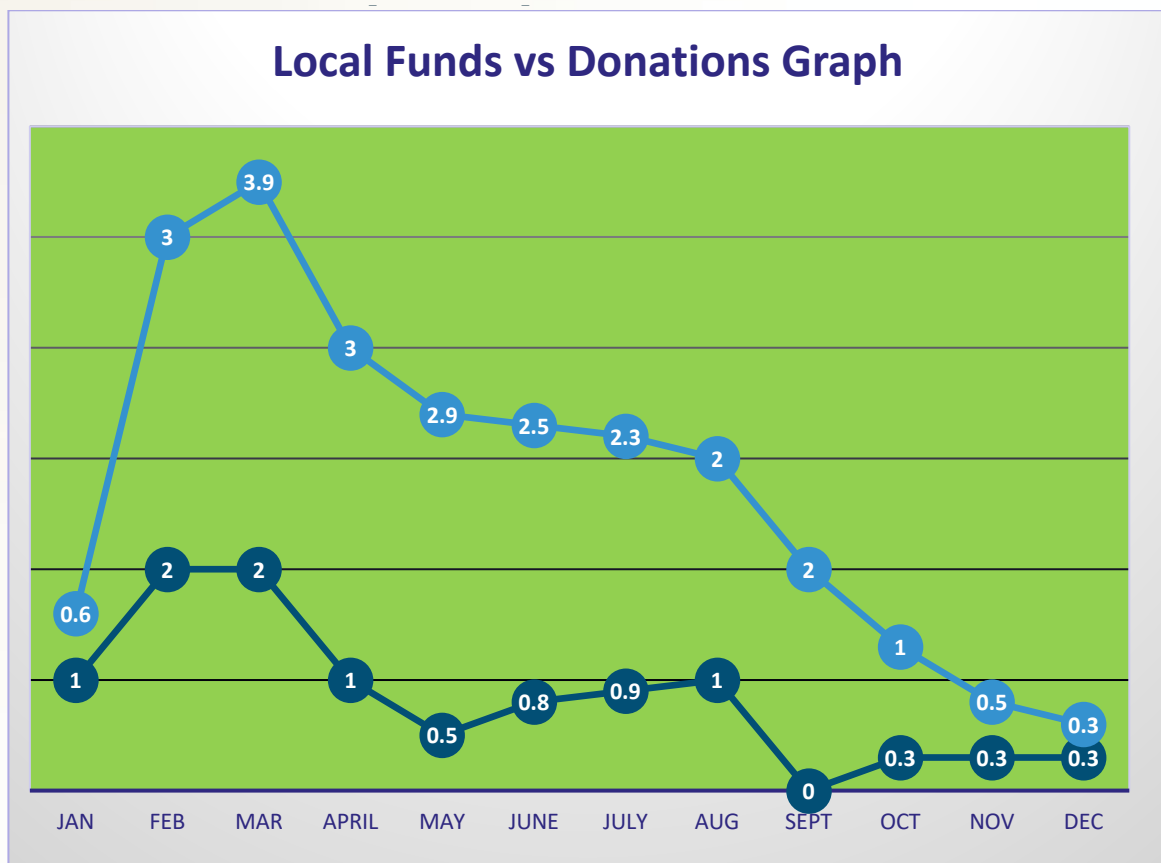
### a) Income

**AMA local Funds Vs Donations comparison Graph.**



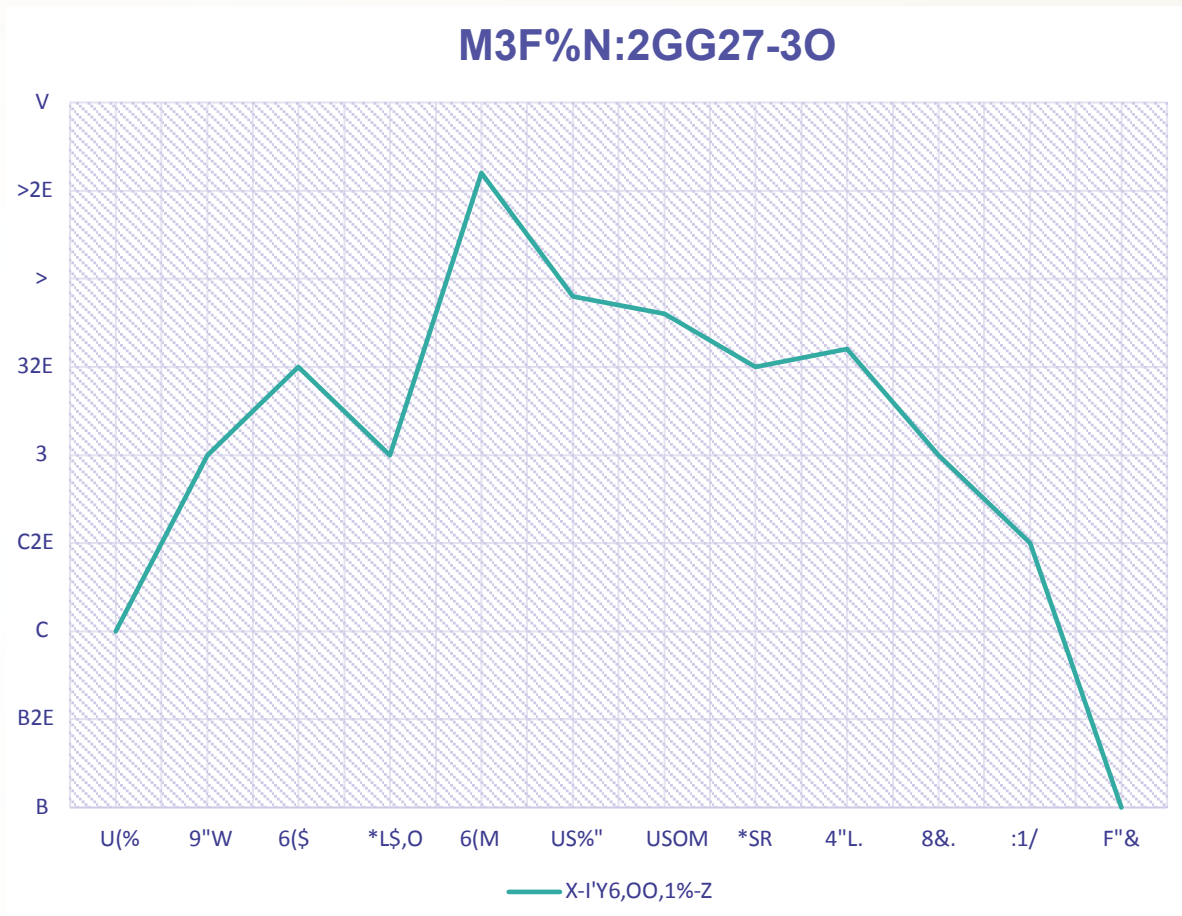
